

Oscar's Place Donkey Adoption Center and Sanctuary in Hopland, California is Verified by the Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries



August 3, 2021 (Hopland, CA) – The Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries (GFAS), the only globally recognized organization providing standards for identifying legitimate animal sanctuaries, awarded Verified status to Oscar's Place Donkey Adoption Center and Sanctuary as of August 1, 2021.

Verification means that Oscar's Place Donkey Adoption Center and Sanctuary meets the criteria of a true equine sanctuary/rescue and is providing humane and responsible care of the animals. To be awarded Verified status, an organization must meet GFAS's rigorous and peer-reviewed animal care standards which are confirmed by a site visit and they must also adhere to a demanding set of ethical and operational principles. The Verification status also provides a clear and trusted means for the public, donors, and grantors to recognize Oscar's Place as an exceptional organization.

"We are proud to announce the recent Verification of Oscar's Place Donkey Adoption Center and Sanctuary," said Daryl Tropea Ph.D., GFAS Program Director-Equine.

"Although this is a new organization, it is a very promising organization, providing adoption and sanctuary for donkeys in need. From their beginning, this organization has evolved based on best practices of animal care, management, and governance. An important part of their advocacy work will be to bring attention to the plight of donkeys around the world whose numbers are declining due to the demand for their hides in traditional Chinese medicine. We expect Oscar's Place to have a significant impact on the welfare of donkeys for years to come."

"I am committed to doing everything in my power to help these donkeys," said Ron King, Executive Director of Oscar's Place. "I was advised early on that accreditation from GFAS would provide us the resources and validation needed to accelerate our work."
