

Previously a Texas cattle ranch, Blue Horse Sanctuary transforms itself into a Verified equine sanctuary and becomes certified by the Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries

May 11, 2022 (Bluff Dale, TX) – The Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries (GFAS), the only globally recognized organization providing standards for identifying legitimate animal sanctuaries, awarded Verified status to the Blue Horse Sanctuary as of April 19, 2022.

Verification means that the Blue Horse Sanctuary meets the criteria of a true equine sanctuary/rescue and is providing humane and responsible care of the animals. To be awarded Verified status, an organization must meet GFAS's rigorous and peer-reviewed animal care standards which are confirmed by a site visit and they must also adhere to a demanding set of ethical and operational principles. The Verification status also provides a clear and trusted means for the public, donors, and grantors to recognize Blue Horse Sanctuary as an exceptional organization.

"I have ridden - as well as painted - horses all my life and now am so honored to be able to give back a small portion of what they have given me - love, friendship and spiritual insight. To date Blue Horse Sanctuary has provided a home for 28 equines, complete with health care, nutrition, a loving environment with room to roam, and the freedom to live out their lives in peace," said Melissa Auberty, Executive Director, Blue Horse Sanctuary.

"We are proud to announce the recent Verification of Blue Horse Sanctuary," said Traci Hanson, GFAS Program Director-Equine. "Not only is Blue Horse a forever home for horses and burros, but the sanctuary also donates hay grown at the sanctuary to other equine organizations in need.
